

WHO SAVES US includes three monumental papers portraying childish superheros, three small paintings of pharmaceutical packagings, a big canvas and a banner with challenging slogans, an existentialist sound installation, the oil painting of a stuffed animal and a magical steel and wooden object. A few unique ceramic plates by Chiara Camoni are set on a silk tablecloth stained with wild plants to complete the exhibition.

The catalogue, designed by CCN Studio (Lia Cecchin), will be presented at the opening.

Luca Bertolo (1968, Milano, IT) attended the Graduate Degree Course in Information Technology from 1987 until 1992 at Milano Università Statale, where he began writing his thesis on Mathematical Logic while taking other courses in art and working as an illustrator. Following a period of residence in London, he returned to Italy and graduated from the Brera Fine Arts Academy in 1998. He moved to Berlin the same year, where he lived until 2005. The artist currently lives in a small village in Tuscany and teaches painting at the Academy of Fine Arts in Bologna.
